

EVERY DAY IS EARTH DAY FOR ALSACE WINEMAKERS

This northeastern French region is one of the top three greenest wine-producing areas in France, with 35% of all vineyards certified organic or in conversion. Alsace producers were also pioneers in biodynamics with the first Alsace vineyard certified in 1969. In 2021, Alsace counts 109 wine estates certified in biodynamics (3.3% of producers). Those numbers continue to climb!

Alsace enjoys a sunny and dry climate favorable to green practices as the Vosges Mountains to the west form a natural barrier protecting the vineyards. But that's not all it takes! So how are such exceptional wines produced in Alsace? The answer lies in know-how acquired over centuries, dedication to respecting the land, creating wines that reflect their specific terroir and preserving the environment for future generations.

This Earth Day, there's no better way to celebrate than with Alsace's many shades of green.
